CHARGING

Attendees will be able to charge their phones and devices at several locations across the CBR Moot Site including Rainbow Recharge, Contingent Leader Space and the Café.

SHUTTLE BUS

Shuttle buses will run each day we are onsite and will make stops along a route to Cooleman Court (local shopping centre) and then on to the city. Details of departure times can be found at the bus terminal and

MERCHANDISE

TOILETS

The CBR Moot Site runs on a septic tank system and as such, toilets are for the disposal of human waste and toilet paper only. Please do not flush any other items down the toilet or the system may become blocked. Sanitary bins and ordinary bins are provided for your convenience.

LAUNDRY

There are laundry facilities onsite. You will need to provide your own laundry detergent or you can

purchase some from the Cafe for \$1 per load.

WRISTBAND

& YOUR

CBR Moot is a cash-free site. Your wristband needs to stay on your wrist for the entirety of the event and will be used to scan you in and out of site, scan in for meals and purchase items while onsite.

To add Moot Money to your wristband, you can log into the registration system, via the Status page press add money and nominate how much you would like to load (transaction fees apply) there, or visit one of our self-service Moot Money Top Up Stations located around the site.

PHONE RECEPTION

& WIFI

There is limited phone reception at the CBR Moot Site with some Telstra (and other providers on the same network) reception.

CBR Moot is offering complimentary WiFi to all attendees onsite, password provided on registration. If you loose the password - Admin have your back!

Canberra public CBRfree WIFI can be accessed across many outdoor areas in Canberra town centres.

& SERVICES

If you require access to a private space for the purposes of religious worship, or you wish to attend religious services while at CBR Moot, please speak to your Contingent Leader or visit us at the Admin. We will do our best to facilitate your requirements.

SMOKING

TIPS FOR STAYING SAFE AT MOOT

Australia is a unique and fantastic place; we hope you enjoy your time at CBR Moot. We ask that you read the following information carefully as your personal safety is of the upmost importance.

SNAKES

In the ACT snakes are most active from October to March when they sun themselves or when they move in search of food or water. If you see a snake at the CBR

Moot Site, do not approach it and notify the CBR Moot Team immediately. Snakes are protected by law in all States and Territories of Australia and may not be killed unless they threaten life. If you are bitten by a snake, stay calm, sit down and send for help.

SPIDERS

Most spiders that you will find are harmless, especially if you leave them alone. In the unlikely event that you are bitten or think you have been bitten by a spider, stay carm, stay still, DO NOT WASH the wound and send for help.

FIRST AID & WELFARE

CBR Moot is supported by the CBR Moot First Aid and Welfare Team, who are providing 24/7 first aid and welfare services onsite. They are located at the Welfare & First Aid Building.

If you're feeling unwell or require first aid, please visit!

If you require urgent medical assistance, contact CBR Moot Team and Welfare & First Aid Team will be

dispatched to you.

SECURITY

CBR Moot has an onsite security team comprising of professional security and additional volunteers. To ensure the safety of yourself and all attendees, you are required to follow the instructions of all Security staff.

HEAT

With hot day and overnight temperatures forecast for CBR Moot, it is important for everyone to be aware of how best to beat the heat and reduce the risk of heatrelated illness.

Keep hydrated - drink plenty of water.Plan your day around the heat.

Avoid alcohol and caffeine - they can make dehydration worse.
 Soak- take a cool shower or a dip in the pool to help you cool down.

Rest make sure you get enough sleep, and rest if you feel tired. We recommend not sleeping in your tent during the day as it can get very hot in the tents.

Eat fresh - try eating cold foods such as salads or fruit. Check on others.

Be cool - seek shade when outside or choose activities that will keep you cool.

Dress smart - wear lightweight clothing and follow the below sun-smart guidelines.

SAFETY

Safety of all CBR Moot attendees is paramount. There are several important rules for the purpose of managing safety & risk which all attendees need to abide by:

1. This is a Scouting event and all attendees are expected to abide by the Scout Law and Promise at all times. All attendees must also abide by the Scouts Australia Adult Code of Conduct.

2. All attendees must abide by Australian and relevant state laws, as applicable.

3. CBR Moot Committee has the right to search any tent and

belongings if required whilst onsite.

4. Attendees may have their involvement at CBR Moot terminated for misconduct or inappropriate behaviour, with transport costs fully borne by the attendee.

5. Contingent Leaders are responsible and accountable for conduct of their Contingent members.

6. CBR Moot operates a fully licenced bar and practices responsible service of alcohol in line with Australian & ACT legislation. Decisions made by the bar or security staff are final and protected decisions under this legislation. Attendees are to follow & abide by the National Rover Council Alcohol Guidelines.

7. Alcohol is not permitted outside the fully licenced area (the fenced area of the bar/arena), any members found with alcohol outside the licenced area will be subject to significant consequences. You are not allowed to bring your own alcohol into the licensed area. Mandatory storage is available via the Administration Office for alcohol that is returning to site from off-site tours, activities, & Expeditions.

No fires are permitted (with the exception of Catering & 8. vendors specifically approved by the Sites & Services Director and Risk Manager), this includes but not limited to: campfires, fireworks, fire twirling, incendiaries, candles, gas lanterns, barbeques - in other words anything that emits a flame or generates a flame through heat or other means.

Generators, driving of vehicles on site (unless specifically 9. approved by the Sites & Services Director) is not permitted.

10. Smoking including Vape is only permitted in the designated smoking areas located in numerous locations around the site (please refer to site map).

All incidents and identified hazards are to be reported to 11. the Administration Office.

12. CBR Moot is held during a time of warm weather. Sunburn, dehydration & heat related illness are real possibilities – please drink plenty of water & stay out of the sun.

SAFETY

13. On certain days, due to weather and Fire Risk, the event may be relocated please see "Event Relocation" information.


14. Rubbish must be disposed of in the rubbish bins provided.

15. Your conduct on social media is reflective on Rover Scouts & the wider Scouting community—do not post compromising or inappropriate material.

EVACUATION

In the event of a major emergency or an immediate risk of safety of the CBR Moot Site, you will be notified to convene at the mustering point via the PA System at which point you will be accounted for by your Contingent Leader (or delegate).

Please move to the mustering point promptly as time is critical.



EVENT RELOCATION

CBR Moot is being held during a period of the year that is considered high-risk for weather events, specifically fire weather due to hot, dry & windy conditions.

CBR Moot has several defined triggers to relocate from the site in the event of these conditions, well before there is an imminent threat to attendees.

If relocation due to weather events is determined, you will be notified by the CBR Moot Team via the onsite PA System the night prior to the relocation.

We will relocate the following morning between 6am and 7:30am. In the event of a relocation, an alternate activity is planned for the day off site. You will be notified to convene with your contingent at the mustering point via the PA System at which point you will be accounted for by your Contingent Leader (or delegate).

Please move to the mustering area promptly as time is critical. Our muster location is the Transport Hub.

CONSENT

The CBR Moot Organising Committee and the ACT Branch as the hosting Branch take the safety of all attendees at CBR Moot seriously. This briefing is designed to ensure that all attendees understand consent as it relates to physical and sexual consent.

- At CBR Moot we hold that:
- Consent is a legal matter. The law considers that a person cannot give consent if their judgement is impaired by drugs, alcohol or fatigue.
- Consent is given freely and voluntarily.
- Consent is not given where there is any coercion; or where negative consequences for withholding consent are real or imagined.
- Consent is clear, unambiguous, positive and enthusiastic. Receiving no response is not consent. Reluctant acceptance and/or submission is not consent. Any unwanted sexual activity or unwanted touching of a person's body by another person may be considered sexual assault.
 This may include touching, slapping or kissing someone else without

consent, it may also include exposing yourself to someone else without consent. Any unwanted sexual advance, including sexually explicit conversations (in person or via message), requesting sex or sexual acts, sexually based or suggestive comments or jokes may be considered sexual harassment.

- Consent also extends to privacy. All attendees at CBR Moot are entitled to have their personal space respected. This includes ensuring that all attendees have safe, private spaces to conduct their personal business. This means that it is not appropriate to observe others while they conduct private activities (e.g showering) unless you have been given explicit, enthusiastic consent.
- Taking and sharing of intimate photos without consent is a crime.
 Sharing intimate photos without consent is a crime.

If CBR Moot is made aware of a situation in which it is alleged that consent has not been given the matter will be reported to ACT Policing to investigate.

DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY


In accordance with the Rovers Australia Drug and Alcohol Guidelines, CBR Moot participants are required to follow the below guidelines throughout the duration of the event. For participants and staff who do not adhear to the CBR Moot Policy, CBR Moot reserves the right to engage local law enforcement and/or send participants home at their own expense.

Alcohol is only permitted within the designated bar area during the operating time. No attendee is permitted to bring their own alcohol on site. Any alcohol that is purchased at an Offsite Activity or Expedition can be checked at Admin to be collected

after the event.

Any recreational Drugs are not permitted at CBR Moot under any circumstances.

RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL GUIDELINES

This section lays out guidelines regarding the responsible use and promotion of alcohol at activities attended by Australian Rovers.

1. It is recognised that attendees are 18 years and over are legally permitted to drink alcohol and should do so in a responsible manner in addition the responsible use of alcohol must be promoted by the organisers of all Rover activities where alcohol is either available or provided.

2. The attendees respective Contingent have a duty of care towards each other at CBR Moot. attendees at CBR Moot will respect this and behave and consume alcohol in a responsible manner. Individuals under 18 will not be permitted on site.

3. The use of alcohol is defined to be a problem when it adversely affects others or, affects the safety of the attendee in question. Before an attendees use of alcohol becomes a problem, their Crew, friends and Contingent must take action to remedy the situation. In the absence of the attendees own Crew or Contingent, action must be taken by any other Rovers present and the organisers of CBR Moot.

4. Attendees are to be discouraged from discussing or boasting about their consumption of alcohol at inappropriate times, including younger members of the Scout Association, Leaders and the public. attendees are encouraged to promote a culture of responsible use of alcohol. 5. Attendees should avoid displaying images of or giving reference to CBR Moot, Rovers Australia or Scouts Australia where Rovers have consumed alcohol in an irresponsible manner.

6.Attendees will not be served while wearing the Scout Uniform from any country (scarves eccepted).

7. Attendees should consider the appropriateness of engaging in unsuitable songs or chants and in general recognise that to encourage a culture of responsible use of alcohol songs or chants about excessive or inappropriate alcohol consumption should be discouraged at all times.

8. Fatigue while driving is recognised as a significant health and safety risk to attendees. As such attendees, Contingents and CBR Moot Organisers will be proactive in reducing the impact that alcohol consumption has on fatigue and driving.

9.CBR Moot Organisers will promote awareness to attendees on the health and safety risks associated with the consumption of alcohol. This could include the national guidelines for alcohol consumption and calculation of blood alcohol concentration.

10. CBR Moot will;

- Have specific hours for alcohol consumption.
- Have available non-alcoholic drinks and complimentary water
- Ensure food is available at the bar
- Have other activities available that do not involve alcohol consumption
- Provide signage and information on responsible alcohol consumption

USE OF LEGAL, ILLEGAL AND ILLICIT SUBSTANCES

This section lays out guidelines regarding the manner drugs are dealt with within the CBR Moot.

1. The use of any illegal drug or substance during a Rover or other Scout Australia activity is completely prohibited and any attendee under the influence of or who has recently used an illegal drug must be excluded for any CBR Moot and any other Scouting activites.


2. No attendees shall possess any illegal drug or substance on a activity.

3. Attendees should be vigilant to the negative effects from the use of legal drugs and substances that may have negative side effects and exclude themselves or others from activities if under the influence of such substances.

Particular vigilance should be exercised during and before driving to or on Rover events or activities. Alcohol is only permitted within the designated bar area during the operating time. No attendee is permitted to bring their own alcohol on site. Any alcohol that is purchased at an Offsite Activity or Expedition can be checked at Admin to be collected after the event.

Any recreational Drugs are not permitted at CBR Moot under any circumstances.

CBR Moot Reserve the right to search any attendees belongings under suspicion of any prohibited items.



BETTER WORLD SPACE


The Better World Space provides an opportunity for attendees to engage in activities designed to promote the World Scout Movement Better World Framework.
